

INTERNATIONAL TRAVEL CERTIFICATE TO FRENCH OVERSEAS TERRITORIES

required for the entry or transit on French overseas territories as part of the implementation of Prime Minister's n° 6149/SG instruction of 18 March 2020 regarding the decisions made to tackle the spread of Covid-19 in the field of border control.

This certificate must be presented by travellers to transportation companies before boarding, as well as to French border control authorities (air, maritime, land including railway connections).

Individuals travelling to French overseas territories are informed that they will be subject to a health check upon arrival in the territory, which may result in a decision of quarantine in a dedicated structure or at home.

- Canadian nationals seeking to enter Saint Pierre and Miquelon

- Healthcare workers supporting the fight against Covid-19;
- Goods carriers, including seamen;
- Flight and cargo crews, or travelling as a passenger to their departure base;
- Diplomatic mission staff, or international organisations staff working in headquarters or offices located in France, who are holders of a special residence permit or a type D promae visa ;
- Sint-Marteen nationals seeking to enter Saint-Martin from the Dutch part of the island.
